Understanding *Waiting for Godot* Based on a Psychoanalytic Approach Arash Heydari^{*}

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Abstract

The present paper, drawing upon the intellectual heritage of Psychoanalysis (Freud, Lacan, and zizek), attempts to give an interpretation of Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot. Grounded on the concept of the "das ding", or "the thing", Zizek differentiates between modernism and postmodernism. Based on this division, zizek claims that Waiting for Godot is a Modernist work. We try to challenge him by suggesting that Waiting for Godot is a postmodern work. In this regard, the present paper does not intend to investigate the previous literature on Waiting for Godot, but we try to present a philosophical-psychoanalytic reading and challenge Zizek's interpretation of the play. By adopting such a strategy, the present paper states that "Godot" is a name for "silent scream", since Godot is the name of nothingness, the name of the fundamental absence.
